Abstract:

Polyarteritis nodosa is a systemic vasculitis that involves small and medium sized arteries. Cutaneous polyarteritis nodosa is a rarer variant of classic polyarteritis nodosa with unknown etiopathogenesis^{1,3}. It presents with tender subcutaneous nodules,
