Editorial Note

I am pleased to mention that during the year 2020, special issues on 32nd European Pediatrics Congress - July 22-23, 2020-Webinar were published online well within the time and the print issues were also brought out and dispatched within 30 days of publishing the issue online. Journal of Pediatrics & Health Research during this year also brought out the 6th World Congress on Pediatric Disease, Care & Management. We also brought out 34th Global Summit on Pediatrics. The Journal of Pediatrics & Health Research has an impact factor of 0.82 and ISSN No: 2574-2817. During the calendar year 2019, IPPHR received a total of 15 papers, out of which 10 articles (66%) were rejected in the preliminary screening due to plagiarism or being out of the format and peer review process. During 2019 around 5 articles were subjected for publication after they were accepted in the peer review process. In the 2 issues of Volume 4 published during the year 2019, a total of 5 articles were published (at an average of 2 articles per issue). A total of 30 research scientists from all over the world reviewed the 5 articles published in volume 4. Average publication lag time of an article was further reduced to 2-3 weeks. During the calendar year 2019, a total of 5 Editors, 30 Reviewers joined the board of IPPHR and contributed their invaluable services towards contribution as well as publication of articles.
