

Governance Paradigm in Public Health and Nursing based on Human Rights: Ukrainian context

Abstract

The main impulse of the study is based on the belief that public health issues go far beyond just the medical, legal or managerial aspects and classifications that are being actively developed in interdisciplinary discourse. Touching upon fundamental philosophical positions, the problematics is considered in the unity of socio-political, socio-legal, socio-traditional, historical and cultural, individual psychological and other aspects, in the perspective of which the management component can be crucial for a person in certain historical circumstances. Based on the methodology of public administration, the social structure of public health is analyzed, taking into account the real diversity of its features and available resources. The tasks of public administration in the field of public health and nursing are defined in the context of ensuring human rights and patients' rights in accordance with legal norms and international standards. The analysis of institutional processes in this area allowed substantiating their focus mainly on solving the problems of equal access to health services and health care, non-discrimination and choice. A number of strategic and operational steps have been proposed, the implementation of which can have a positive impact on the development of the industry while countering threats and overcoming the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic. Based on the example of Ukraine, it is argued that the governance paradigm in this area is to combine its three organic components: public health, human rights and social justice in accordance with national and international legal traditions.
