



## Management of Renal Abscess in a 5-Year-Old Girl, A Case Report

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### Abstract:

Renal abscesses are rare in children. They have vague manifestations and any delay in proper diagnosis and treatment could lead to morbidity and mortality. We present a 5-year-old girl with multiple renal abscesses after pyelonephritis that lead to total nephrectomy due to multiple drug resistance. The renal abscess may have subtle symptoms. Early diagnosis and treatment strongly prevent undue mortality and morbidity. This case highlights the need for timely diagnosis and proper treatment. There must be a clinical suspicion of renal abscess if treatment does not affect the patient's clinical condition.

Thus, proper diagnosis and treatment are necessary. Renal abscesses should be seriously considered when a patient presents with symptoms of pyelonephritis but does not respond to standard treatments. Renal abscess presents with symptoms of pyelonephritis but does not respond to standard treatments.
