

## ***Perception of the role of the professional in nursing and gender. A survey in the city of Cuernavaca, Mor; México***

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### **Abstract**

Since 2012, México reports that 9 out of 10 professionals are nurses (1), because of this there has been an increase in enrollment with male students (2), so it is necessary to fund the population's perception of the their performance, generating new hypotheses to know the new challenges facing the male nursing professional in health services. The major role of a nurse is to take care of all the patients of any religioius background. A nurse os a care-taker for pateints who prevent them from illness and improve health condition. A patient is a first priority for a nurse whether it is male or female nurses. After all, a nurse is a nurse whether it is male or female. Back in 1960s, only 2% of male worked as nurse. But, the count is in steady growth with 13%now

### **Methodology:**

We have carried out a survey in the city of Cuernavaca where 200 people participated in which five questions were formed that formed to form a directed interview used as an information collection instrument.

### **Results:**

In general, a total of 200 interviews were obtained in which 37% of the population interviewed has been attended by a nurse of which 77% say they had an excellent and / or good experience with their performance.

In this study, we found that the traditional aspect of both women and men was observed in front of the stigmatization of the nurse's care, and especially of men, since before being cared by male nurse, they preferred a female-nurse to be treated, although all interviewed they have had health experiences with male nurses.

### **Conclusions:**

The stereotype that the population has of nurses is one of the main challenges that will be taken into account to develop new proposals in their nurse training and thereby overcome this cultural barrier.
