

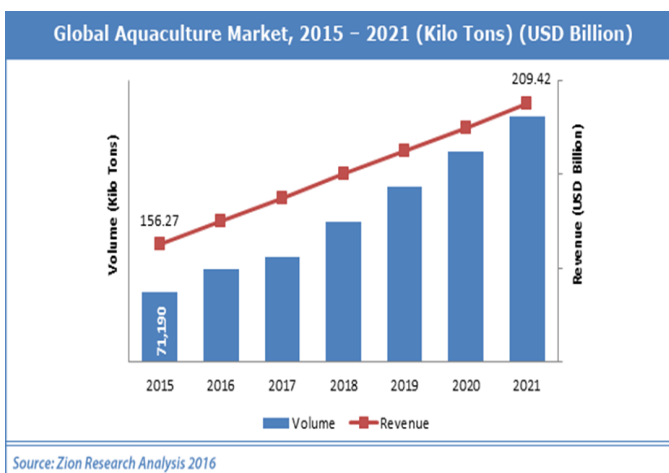
Market Analysis of Aquaculture Asia Pacific 2020

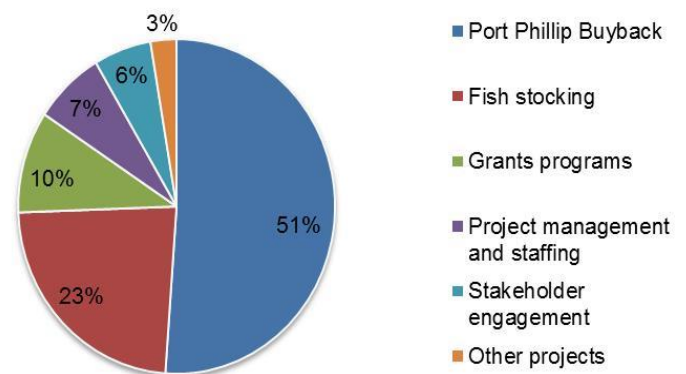


Why is it Japan?
